Matt's Minute

"War is not the absence of conflict; war is the inability to deal with conflict." - Peter Rollins.

"Understanding then, can lead to love. But the reverse is also true. Love brings understanding: the two are reciprocal." - Huston Smith

It is overly simplistic to say we live in a deeply divided world. Our country is grounded in conflict, with others and with ourselves. One only needs to glance at the timeline of our young country to see much of it was spent fighting with one another or fighting an outside enemy. This brings us to our current global context, a beautiful and deeply disturbing reality, one that calls us into conversation with those who are different than ourselves more often than it used to. I enter into this conversation often, as many of you do. My hope, ultimately, is not to change anyone's mind, but to develop relationships and live more intentionally in a community, however challenging that might be. I was asked recently if I think Christians ought to be more pro-active against Islam. With that one sentence, the conversation is no longer a conversation, but a call towards fear and hatred.

The rise of Islamophobia in our country can be credited to our media and many Christian pastors. Taking a cue from the fundamentalists in the Middle East, many pastors are calling for Christians to take a stand against Islam. Our so-called battle for freedom is not about religion, it is about an unwillingness to enter into the conversation. Our first reaction is fear and

what quickly follows is a mobilization to fight. The anniversary of 9/11 is a reminder of a tragedy that took many lives. For that, the motto, "never forget" seems quite appropriate. The anniversary of 9/11 is also an unfortunate reminder of the unfortunate lack of progress in our country's understanding and sentiment towards Islam and anyone else outside our borders.

I remember much about that day. Like many of you, I remember where I was, what I was doing and the phone calls I made within minutes asking, "Are you watching this?" What I also remember was the almost immediate fear and hatred towards the other, masked in patriotism and defense of our great country. I cannot recall many seeking conversation, understanding or true justice. Before we even knew who we were fighting against, we pledged to destroy them. Certainly the terminology of justice was thrown around, but not true justice. We were talking revenge. We were talking retaliation. What saddens me most is not how we reacted in that moment, but how little progress we have made towards understanding, conversation and cooperation. Xenophobia is still rampant and those voices that should be promoting tolerance, peace and reconciliation just keep going inside their shells, allow-

ing the voices of hatred and fanaticism drown out any voice of reason.

I believe the gospel calls us toward love first. Love can find pathways towards conversation. Conversation leads to understanding. Understanding then leads us towards reconciliation and cooperation, which then brings us back to love. In the words of Huston Smith: "The only thing that is unqualifiedly good is extended vision, the enlargement of one's understanding of the ultimate nature of things... understanding then, can lead to love. But the reverse is also true. Love brings understanding: the two are reciprocal."


