Matt's Minute

Solar Panels and First Christian Church

Remember our conversation about solar panels? For a refresher course or if you are new to FCC, see graphs and read my article in the June 17th edition of the *Disciples Dispatch*: http://heartofcorvallis.org/wp-content/up-loads/2014/07/fcdd_061714link.pdf. Copies are also available in the church office.

First, the good news: After much discussion on Monday, September 22, the church board recommends that the congregation move forward with the Oregon Solar Incentive Program and finance the initial cost through a loan from Church Extension. We invite everyone to participate in a congregational meeting on Sunday, October 5 right after worship. We will need congregational approval for financing this project. This will be a time to get members' votes and a time to answer any remaining questions about our solar panel project.

So, how did we get from our meeting in June to this recent decision? At our last congregational meeting, the finance team was charged with three tasks:

1. Explore financing options.

We examined borrowing from our permanent funds, fundraising, using Craft Fair monies and taking a loan from Church Extension. All of these options were discussed. The decision was made to not use Craft Fair money from this year's Craft

Fair (still an option two years from now). The finance team decided the best option was a loan from Church Extension. Thank you to Ann Smart for researching loan options from Church Extension, our denomination's lending arm.

2. Get two more bids.

Out of the two other local companies, only one did projects of our size. The one bid we had came out about 3000 over our initial bid from Abundant Solar.

3. Follow up on Abundant Solar's references.

A special thank you goes to Aaron Marchbanks for making phone calls. The references were overwhelmingly positive. Based on comments and responses to specific questions, the consensus among the respondents is that Abundant Solar comes to us very highly recommended.

In the end, the finance cabinet decided it was best to bring the decision to the church board last night. The board passed a motion to move forward with our project. I am so proud of our community for taking on a project of this magnitude after such intentional discernment. Thank you to everyone who cares about FCC and its future. Mark your calendars and be at our special congregational meeting on October 5, right after worship.



FEDICE Volunteers to Speak on Oct. 25

Two Oregon women who have worked with FEDICE in Ecuador this year will share their experiences next month. Bethany Waggoner and Kelsey Hertel will speak and share photos on the afternoon of Saturday, October 25 from 3-5 p.m. at First Christian Church in Eugene.

The gathering on Saturday, October 25 will feature presentations by both Bethany and Kelsey. Desserts and beverages will be served. Items from the famous market in Otavalo will be raffled off.
