After worship, we had a newcomer lunch at Disciples House. 20 of us squeezed around the Disciples House table and were treated to an amazing lunch prepared by about 10 volunteers. We

I went home and played trains with my four year old for awhile. Then, we headed back to church to serve dinner to the students at Disciples House. We served mostly leftovers from the lunch. It was inspiring to see how much they care for one another and how much life they have. What an amazing ministry we have going, thanks to the vision and generosity of so many people.

Service Sunday: Opportunities to Serve

Some important reminders about this Sunday. We will have a short service at 10:00 a.m. and then go and serve our community.

- 1. Wear your work clothes (jeans and t-shirts)

- 4. There are four projects **on-site**, so if you have mobility concerns or do not feel like working outside, you can stay here.

On-Site Projects:

- Flower Pots of Love: Designing and filling planter pots to distribute to our homebound people.
- Lunch Prep: We need 8 dedicated people to make lunch for about 75 people.
- Thank You Cards: Designing and writing thank you cards to send to our service men and women.
- **Stuffing Envelopes:** 5 people needed for some good old fashioned assembly line work, stuffing and preparing envelopes for United Way

Off-Site Projects:

- Sage Gardens: Clean-up, harvesting, weeding, winter preparation. A good, hands-on, get dirty project. Lots of people needed.
- South Corvallis Food Bank: Deep Cleaning, behind shelves, behind refrigerators, up high, in the corners.
- Heartland Humane Society: Kitty Caretaker, work with cattery staff to clean, sanitize, water, feed and set-up all cats in the Front Cattery Window

Praise God! The Remodel Loan was Wrapped Up on Oct. 1.

We started the Capital Campaigns in the spring of 1995 and took out a construction loan eighteen months later. In phase two, we increased the loan to remodel the sanctuary. In total we borrowed \$450,000 from Church Extension and together we have paid it off! For those of you who missed out on the rickety wooden stairs on the back of the building, the lack of an elevator and accessible bathrooms, buckets on the third floor to catch all the leaks. yellowed coverings on the stained glass windows, unreliable fuel oil furnace, worn carpet of various colors, small narthex, and a small kitchen that couldn't pass the Health Dept. regulations to allow us to do Stone Soup, it is probably hard to visualize what the church was like 20 years ago. The remodels have allowed us to increase our programming and truly be a church that welcomes all.

With a building built in 1924-25 there are always plenty of project to do, but hopefully nothing as major as moving all the stairways, exterior doors, and most of the bathrooms again. During this last campaign we paid off the loan, painted the exterior of the church and repaired the outside window sills on the west. There is a little more work to do on the internal west window sills and the remaining pledge payments will be for that. The Capital Campaign 7—Wrapped Up ends Dec. 31. Thank you for all your faithfulness.




FEDICE Volunteers to Speak on Oct. 25
