Matt's Minute

Let me paint a picture for you. Imagine sitting around a table with a music teacher, a few computer engineers, a biochemist, a mechanical engineer, a few soil and crop scientists, a zoologist, a minister, an occupational therapist and three rowdy kids. They are from three different countries. Now imagine them carving pumpkins, some of them for the first time.

Hopefully you have a picture in your head by now and no, this is not the beginning of a bad joke, but the scene at Disciples House last night. First Christian decided a little over a decade ago to purchase the historic house next door with the vision of it being an intentional co-housing, service-based learning community for students. Even though leadership has changed a few times, the church continues to support this intentional ministry. In the absence of a resident director, Miranda and I (and our kids) have been providing dinner and meeting with the residents over the last few weeks. It does make for a long Sunday, but it is truly inspiring to spend time with these young people. What a great group we have this year! Despite their busy schedules and many outside commitments, all of them are finding time to meet for dinner and put in their service hours (many of those service hours happening at Stone Soup). I feel like the church is connecting with the students, but more importantly, the students are connecting with each other and the Corvallis community.

We have an opportunity to give and receive much from the Disciples House. We need help with the ongoing maintenance work on a century old house. We need help with deep cleaning projects around the house. We need help providing meals for the students every Sunday at 6:00 p.m. You can either make food or give money towards the costs of food. In our experience, it takes about \$50 - \$75 to provide food for a Sunday evening meal. We need people who can engage the students in learning to cook. We need people to simply form relationships with our students by coming to dinner or providing a relevant program for our students after our meal. We need people to help coordinate service for our students by raising awareness of opportunities in our community.

This help is needed before we hire someone to serve as resident director at the house and after we hire someone. There is a real richness at Disciples House, a richness that I hope some people will step up and take part in.




