# Matt's Minute

I love good stories. I try to tell good stories. This time of year is full of good stories. There are stories of hope, generosity, love, abundance and new life. The season of Christmas is a time of giving and receiving, a time to inspire, and a time for extravagance. That is why I have a few stories for you.

Long before I got here, First Christian Church developed a "Minister's Discretionary Fund" that would go to support people in need. This was the church's response to those who come to ask for help at the church at the money could be spent using the minister's discretion. All receipts would then be kept and recorded by the treasurer for accountability purposes. Many of you have donated to this fund, sometimes when donations are given for "those in need," the money goes in this fund. More often than you think, people who the church has helped in the past give money back to the church and these donations are put in this fund. In all these cases, items or goods are purchased for the individual, no cash is given out. Below are a few stories of how you helped this year through this fund.

After some difficult times, one young man got a job as an independent day laborer at a construction site. As a hard and talented worker, he was up for promotion two weeks after he started, but did not have the tools needed. The church was able to buy him some tools to keep him going in this industry and he is working full-time making excellent wages and just received another promotion.

One young woman was working on getting a job, but running low on money and ran out of cell phone minutes. The church was able to put some money on her cell phone card to then receive the call from a potential employer to receive a job she applied for. One young mother needed formula and diapers to get her through the end of the money. Thank you, church.

A survivor of domestic violence now staying a COI is trying to restart her life and received a scholarship to Linn Benton Community College to get started on a certificate program, the church paid for her application fee. She will start classes during the winter term.

Several tents, sleeping bags and tarps were purchased to help our homeless community during the months the shelter is closed.

One older gentleman's brother died, funds were used to get him to California and back to be with his family during a difficult time.
