Communicating About Communication

This fall, we hosted a series of "cottage meetings" in homes and at the church. These conversations are helping to steer our directions for the future. One of the important, yet less glamorous topics is communication. I believe there was a desire for more communication, conversation about how we communicate and who is "in the loop" of communication.

Over the next few months, we will be trying to communicate more about what is happening in the life of the church. Our weekly Dispatch (newsletter) will continue to happen every week, but we will be trying to communicate more using our Facebook page and e-mail updates. What you might see is some duplication. For example, you might see the same information in the newsletter, then again on the Facebook, and perhaps on a group e-mail too. We are already using some

e-mail distribution lists to communicate directly with specific groups in the church, but will utilize this tool more as well. Another communication link that we will be exploring in the next few months are the possibility of using text messaging updates. This would be a "subscription" based service that people could opt-in or opt-out of. All this means that we need your help communicating about communication. Like the three bears, we need your feedback to say too little, too much or just right. I must also say that I know some of you are not "wired" to the internet or checking your cell phone every five minutes. We also need your help in telling us how you are feeling connected or disconnected from the church. Are there better ways we can communicate with you?


