# FCC: Powered With Help from the Sun



We have finally seen the first bill including solar generation from the power company. The May electric bill (from March 16 to April 15) was \$835.89 less a \$78.57 credit for the electricity we produced. Additionally, in about 30 days we will receive a check for \$376.95 which will be our incentive payment for the period.

According to our energy tracking website, as of May 4 we have produced 2.27 megawatt-hours. This is roughly equivalent to planting 41 trees. (Planting a tree offsets the same amount of CO2 as 55.3 kilowatt-hours of clean energy production.)



# Earthquake in Nepal from Rev. Vy T. Nguyen

Dear Friends,

Our hearts and prayers have been with the people of Nepal after a 7.9 magnitude earthquake struck west of Nepal's capital of Kathmandu this past Saturday. The earthquake was also felt and caused significant damage in the neighboring countries of India, Tibet, Bangladesh and China. This is the most powerful earthquake to hit the region in over 80 years.


