Festival of Homelitics

I am out of the office this week at the Festival of Homelitics. Homelitics refers to the art of sermon writing and preaching. It comes from an old Greek word that means converse or conversation. My impression is that preaching can often become what Doug

Pagitt calls "speeching." A speech is something given that requires little more than listening. A speech can be eloquent and inspiring. A speech is almost always a monologue. Preaching, on the other hand, should be dialogue. Preaching ought to require a response and reaction. Preaching is meant to inspire and should be eloquent, but it should also be provocative. Preaching ought to illicit a strong response. I like the word homelitics because it calls us to a deeper conversation. I am excited about my upcoming conference. Thank you to the church that provides continuing education resources for my journey. I will back in time to share a homily on Sunday!




