A Look Back at Craft Fair 2014

Dear church members and friends,

The members of the Finance Cabinet propose removing the church building from the Corvallis Local Register of Historic Landmarks. By having the church building on the local historic register, we receive the benefit of being listed as a historic building. We do not receive any tax benefit or other incentive.

Because of our historic listing, each time we want to make changes that affect the exterior of the building, we are required to go through the Corvallis Planning Division and, often, the Historic Resources Commission (HRC). This process can add about 90 days to the permit process. Our permit may even be denied, because the Corvallis Planning Division or the HRC deems the proposed changes would make the appearance of the church historically inaccurate. There was concern in the congregation that the building permit for the solar panels installation would be denied by the HRC. However, the panels were installed in a way that they were not readily visible from the ground and

were approved for installation rather easily.

The application to remove the church building from the register is an administrative procedure done through the Corvallis Planning Division. The application requires a \$100 deposit and a \$2508 non-refundable fee. The Finance Cabinet believes the application process and fees are worth the effort and expense in order to streamline the permit process for exterior projects as we strive to maintain and improve our building through the many years ahead.
