# In Sunday School... from Emily, Vicki, and Leah

The children continue to learn about Nepal and why we are sending the proceeds of the Craft Fair to help with earthquake relief.

The middle class learned more about Hinduism as a way of studying the people and culture of Nepal. They learned specifically about "rangoli" which is a folk art where one creates a sacred welcoming area on living room floors or courtyards by drawing patterns with colored rice, dry flour, colored sand, or flower petals. In the picture Nina and Lily are making a rangoli outside of Disciples House.



For the first time this week the older class left for Sunday School directly after the first song in worship and had an extra long class. This allowed much more time for conversation and snack eating! They continued to discuss why we help other people, how we decide who to help, and how we figure out the best way to help. We also had enough time to discuss homework, allowances, and other subjects that naturally came up in our conversation.


