# Matt's Minute

"Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them. And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit..."

- Acts 2:3-4

This Sunday, June 4 is Pentecost. For many reasons, Pentecost holds a special place in my heart. As a kid, we celebrated Pentecost as the birthday of the church (which meant cake before lunch). It was on Pentecost as a young adult that I made a public declaration to commit my life to Christian ministry. It was on Pentecost many years later that I was ordained to Christian ministry. It was on Pentecost five years ago that I began my service here at First Christian Church.

This Sunday will be a celebratory day. In addition to being Pentecost, it is Promotion Sunday. We will celebrate our teachers, our middle school graduates, our elementary school graduates, our high school graduates and all of our kids. Yes, there will be cake. Be there and bring a friend!

Pentecost celebrates the rich history of the church. The church was born on the day of Pentecost. The early followers of Jesus began forming house churches and began formulating the early belief systems of the church. The 11 disciples began telling the stories of Jesus and soon afterwards, Paul, Silas, Timothy and others began travelling around the Mediterranean region to share the good news.

Pentecost is also a celebration of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit represents the living, breathing manifestation of God in the community. The Holy Spirit is often presented as being like fire or like wind. Both images conjure up feelings of energy and boldness. Pentecost is a reminder that things are always moving, always changing and that God is always doing new things in
