### Matt's Minute

We honored our students and teachers this past Sunday, but I feel compelled to say more thanks. Thank you to all our Sunday School teachers and helpers. Our teachers are so thoughtful, so kind, and so committed to making a difference in the lives of our kids. Our Christian education ministry is one of the best for several reasons and I want to share a few.

First, we create a curriculum that is more than kid-focused, but focused on the kids who are a part of our community. Planning efforts always consider the personalities and talents of those who are an active part of our community. There is no such thing as one-size fits all and we are constantly evaluating and restructuring our classrooms to meet the kids where they are at, not where we think they should be.

Second, our classroom looks nothing like a traditional classroom. Our teachers are thinking outside the box and often outside the room to connect our faith with life. Our classrooms reach beyond a didactic environment where kids are listening to a teacher. The conversation is always multi-dimensional and often led by the kids themselves. We are using multi-media in our classrooms, we are going outside, we are using art supplies, we are using

chalkboards, we are using the Bible, we are using literature, we are using food, we are using music, and so much more to tell the story of our faith. This summer, several of our classrooms will be spending time cooking in the kitchen.

Third, our focus is on questions, not answers. As Ranier Maria Rilke says, "Be patient toward all that is unsolved in your heart and try to love the questions themselves, like locked rooms and like books that are now written in a very foreign tongue. Do not now seek the answers, which cannot be given you because you would not be able to live them. And the point is, to live everything. Live the questions now." Our classrooms embody this.

Fourth, our teachers are awesome. Borrowing a quote from the movie *Good Will Hunting*, they are "wicked smart." They are digging deep into their experience and education to open richness into the hearts of our kids. Together, we are sharing our experiences and knowledge to create the best possible environment for our students. Our kids will be coming out of high school with a more sophisticated understanding of the Bible than many first year seminary students.

Finally, we have the best kids in town. They are talented, smart, witty, inquisitive, and highly engaged in the life of the church. Thank you to our students for guiding and directing us. I am certain the teachers share my sentiment that often I learn more from them than they do from me.
