Matt's Minute

A note from the Pastor/Parish committee:

Our committee meets quarterly with Matt to 1) share and discuss feedback from the Congregation with Matt, as well as 2) listen and provide support to Matt relative to his experiences with the church.

We wanted to say thank you to all of you who took the time to reflect upon Matt's strengths and growth opportunities and provide excellent feedback. Twenty-three members of the church and staff provided feedback, representing a broad swath of the congregational demographic. We received feedback from members of the Board, Finance Cabinet, Program Cabinet, newer members, long-time members, etc.

Kathy Crawford, Janet Chenard, and Lee Mason read all the evaluations and compiled a summary, which was presented to Matt at the June 27 Pastor Parish Committee.

One of the topics considered in my evaluation process was worship. Attitudes on worship were overwhelmingly positive, but there were many who expressed a desire to hear more voices and get more people involved. There were some comments that articulated concern that I was doing it all and not making room for others to be participants. I appreciate this feedback and hope to make some changes to make room for more voices and participation.

I need your help in creating and de-

livering some additional liturgy in the service. I hope to develop a schedule of worship liturgists for Sunday and special worship services. A worship liturgist would be reading a call to worship, call to offering and prayer after offering is received. Liturgy is based on lectionary texts and I will use a variety of resources dependent on what my sermon is that week. If you would like to sign-up to be a liturgist, you can give me a call or sign up here: https://goo.gl/bx51Q7. I will send you that week's liturgy to review no later than Thursday.

I also welcome you to submit liturgical resources via e-mail to be included. These resources might include quotations from books, poems, your own creative musings, or liturgical resources from other faith communities. I will do my best to include those resources in the weekly liturgy as they connect with that week's scripture and sermon.
