
Above: The eyes have it! The 2018 budget was easily passed. Thank you to all who worked on it and thank you to the congregation for passing it.

I passed out socks donated by one of our members. Dry socks save lives! A woman came up to me during the meal and was obviously worried. "Where's Kevin?" she asked frantically. I ensured her that his return would be soon, but she was upset because she was moving to Montana and wanted to have an opportunity to thank him for his kindness and love to her. She gave me a big hug and said, "you give that hug to him." She made me promise. I ensured I would.
